Parchment, ff. I + 156 + I, 120 x 90 mm. Dark hairsides; some defective edges and corners (ff. 103, 138).

I-XIII<sup>12</sup>. Horizontal catchwords, first at right or invisible, from f. 72v onwards in center and framed in hairlines.

Pricked and ruled with brown ink for one column of 24 lines below top line. Single bounding lines, but there is variety in the disposition of the horizontal through lines: double lines at the top, in the middle and at the bottom on ff. 1r-60v; double lines at the top and double or single lines at the bottom (ff. 61r-156v).

The manuscript proper (artt. 4-11), is copied by two hands very close to each other: A copied ff. 1r-151r (upper half), 151v-155r, and 156v in *Gothica Semitextualis Libraria*; B copied ff. 151r (lower half) and 155v-156r, i.e. artt. 10 (1) and 11 (2). The musical notation is in *nota quadrata* on 4-line staves coinciding with the ruling (normally four staves on each page). Except in the parts copied by hand B, one or two of the stave lines are coloured (generally the second beige, the fourth red; or only one line red). Art. 1 is copied by a s. XV hand using deviant spellings such as *ingnoscitur, ascendit*. Art. 2 is in s. XVI *Humanistica Cursiva*; musical notation in black and white round notes on an undetermined number of black stave lines. The endleaves (art. 3) are in large Carolingian handwriting.

Red headings and stroking of majuscules; red line-fillers for verses; red or blue paragraph marks. Alternately red and blue 1-line versals (in the text, rare); alternately red and blue 2-3-line flourished initials with penwork in the contrasting colour having long extensions in the left margin. They are placed outside the text area, but from f. 61r (art. 9) onwards they are generally half inserted into the text area. The text copied by hand B as well as the additional artt. 1 and 2 are undecorated. The endleaves (art. 3) have a red heading and red stroking of the opening lines of the *Passio* of St Barnabas written in Capitalis; on the almost entirely lost right-hand column of the rear pastedown the interlace initial *I* in red and yellow is preserved.

Contemporary binding in undecorated white leather (deerskin?) over wooden boards, sewn on three split leather thongs. Remnants of a leather strap attached to the front board and closing over a pin (lost) in the center of the rear board; there are also two rust holes in the boards closer to the spine. Spine damaged. On the endleaves, see artt. 1-3.

On the rear pastedown a s. XV/XVI note by the same hand as art. 1: “Nichil est quod non pulcrius elucescat si plurimorum notitia comprobetur” (Boethius, *De syllogismo hypothetico*, I, CPL 886, PL 64.831).
