Parchment. 2 folios. 289 x 215 mm (written space 230 x 170 mm). 2 columns. 51 (fol. 1) and 58 (fol. 2) lines. Ruled in lead (very faint). Single vertical and double horizontal bounding lines.

Written in a small, highly abbreviated gothic script (*littera textualis currens*). 1-line initials in black are not set apart from the text. Punctuation consists of the punctus. Accents added by a later hand.

These leaves were used as flyleaves in the binding of Lambach Stiftsbibliothek Ccl 48 (shelf number "48" on fol. 1r). A brief description of Lambach Ccl 48, with no mention of the fragments, is in Holter (1959), 255.

A modern hand has written in pencil in the lower right corner the number "85" on fol. 1r and "86" on fol. 2r.

Fol. 1 was formerly Zinniker 227; fol. 2 was Beinecke MS 482.85, Zinniker 15.
