Isaiah 61.6-61.8. Common of Apostles and Martyrs.

Written in large gothic script (*littera textualis*), above the top line. 3-line lesson initials are in red and are written on the vertical bounding line. 1-line verse initials are in red and are set apart from the text. Rubrics are written in red minuscule. Punctuation consists of the punctus

and the punctus elevatus. Hyphenation is in the same ink as the text. Line fillers following rubrics are in red.
