Written in gothic script (*littera textualis*). 1-, 2- and 3-line initials alternate in blue and
red and are not set apart from the text. Other 1-line initials are in black highlighted with red.
Rubrics are written in red in the same script as the text. Punctuation consists of the punctus, the
punctus interrogativus and the punctus elevatus. Hyphenation is in the same ink as the text.

This fragment was once used as a wrapper for a volume measuring ca. 200 x 155 mm.

The letters "PBR" are written in ink on the recto.
