Sunday of Quinquagesima, with lessons from I Corinthians 13.1-13 and Luke 18.31-43.

Parchment. 2 folios (foliated "xxv" and "xxvi" in the top center of the recto). 321 x 255 mm
(written space 262 x 195 mm). 2 columns. 35 lines. Ruled in ink. Single vertical bounding
lines.

Written in two sizes of gothic script (littera textualis), with a slightly smaller script for
chants; on fol. 1v there is a change of hands. 2-line initials at the beginning of masses and
lessons alternate red and blue and are not set apart from the text. 1-line initials are in brown
highlighted with red. Rubrics are written in red in the same script as the text. Punctuation
consists of the punctus. Hyphenation is in the same ink as the text. The foliation is in red.
Several small, original holes in the parchment are circled in red.

The fragment was once used as a wrapper for a volume measuring ca. 320 x 200 mm,
which had the shelf number "78" (or "18"?) at the top of the spine.
