Sap. 16.17 - 17.5. The upper margin has been trimmed with loss of text.

f. 1rb [con]//scien[tia nihil enim est timor] ... [absco]nse enim//

Sap. 17.10 - 18.9. The upper and outer margins have been trimmed with loss of text.

f. 1va [r]//egalibus sedibus durus de]bellator ... [transi]ret illi a[utem nouam mortem
inuenirent omni]s enim cre//[atura]

Sap. 18.15 - 19.6. The upper and outer margins have been trimmed with loss of text.

Prologue to Sirach, 1-20; Stegmüller 26.

Parchment (stained and damaged from binding use). 1 folio. 320 x 220 mm (written space originally ca. 420 x ca. 285 mm). 2 columns. 46 lines remaining (of original ca. 60). Dry-point ruling on the hair side. Single vertical bounding lines.

Written in Caroline minuscule. 2-line initials are in red square capitals, filled with yellow, and are written on the vertical bounding line. 1-line initials are in brown rustic capitals. The incipit is written in red and the explicit in brown rustic capitals. Punctuation consists of the punctus.

The fragment was used as the binding of a volume measuring ca. 160 x 110 mm. The name "Appollinare Matterozzi" is written on the verso in a seventeenth century hand.
