Fol. 1 measures 292 x 195 mm; fol. 2, 295 x 193 mm; fol. 3, 283 x 213 mm; fol. 4 292 x 210 mm (written space 250 x 155 mm). 1 column. 33 lines. Dry-point ruling. Double vertical and horizontal bounding lines. Additional vertical ruling in margins for differentiae and tonary letters.

Written in two sizes of late Caroline minuscule. 2- to 4-line initials at the beginning of feasts and lessons are written in red square capitals and are set apart from the text between double vertical bounding lines. 1-line initials at the beginning of lessons are written in red square capitals with round E and are set apart from the text when they occur at the beginning of a line. 1-line initials of responses and Benedictus and Magnificat antiphons are in thick brown uncials, not set apart from the text. 1-line initials for the other chants are in brown rustic capitals and are frequently traced or dotted with red. 1-line initials within lessons are in brown rustic capitals and are set apart from the text when they occur at the beginning of a line. Rubrics are written in red minuscule. Punctuation consists of the punctus for the chants and the punctus, punctus elevatus and punctus interrogativus for the lessons. Interlinear neumes in the St. Gall style. Neumed differentiae and tonary letters for antiphons are in the outer margins.

These bifolia were used as flyleaves in the binding of Lambach, Ink. 179 (the shelf number "179" is written in ink on fol. 1r), which measured ca. 406 x 285 mm.

The bifolium 1/4 was formerly Beinecke MS 482.42, Zinniker 67; the bifolium 2/3 was formerly Zinniker 172.
