Rubrics are written in red and green minuscule with uncial M. Punctuation consists of the punctus and punctus elevatus. Hyphenation is in the same ink as the text.

The bifolium was once used as a pastedown in the binding of a volume measuring ca. 288 x 185 mm. The number "M103" is written in pencil on fol. 1r in the same hand that wrote the numbers "M105" on Beinecke 481.70 and "M106" on Beinecke 481.106. The number "12" is written in pencil in the lower margin of fol. 1r.
