Order of visiting the sick. The prayer "Omnipotens sempiterne..." is nearly identical to the prayer found in *Das Rheinauer Rituale* (Zuerich Rh 114, Anfang 12.Jh.), ed. Gebhard Huerlimann, *Spicilegium Friburgense* 5 (Freiburg, Schweiz, 1959), 147.

Written in gothic script (*littera textualis*). 2-line initials in red are surrounded by and filled with brown circles and flourishes. 1-line initials are in brown.
