Feria VI after the Fifth Sunday of Pentecost. The lesson is from James 2.14-16.

Parchment. 1 folio (foliated "CXXVII"). 198 x 273 mm (written space originally ca. 320 x 187 mm). 2 columns. 22 lines remaining of an original ca. 42. Ruled in ink. Single vertical bounding lines.

Written in gothic script (*littera textualis formata*). 2-line initials are in red and are not set apart from the text. 1-line initials are in brown highlighted with red. Rubrics are written in red in the same script as the text. The foliation is written in red in the upper center of the recto. Punctuation consists of the punctus and the punctus elevatus. Hyphenation is in the same ink as the text.

The fragment was used as the binding of a volume measuring ca. 145 x 88 mm.
