Written in Caroline minuscule, with a mixture of pre-Caroline and Caroline forms of a. 1-line initials are in brown rustic capitals, with occasional use of uncial m and e, and are set apart from the text when they occur at the beginning of a line. Punctuation consists of the punctus, punctus elevatus, punctus versus and the punctus interrogativus.

The fragment was used as a pastedown in the binding of a volume measuring ca. 240 x 148 mm.
