Written in two sizes of gothic script (*littera textualis*), with a larger script for the lessons and prayers and a smaller script for the chants. 6- to 7-line initials "I" at the beginning of lessons are in red and are set apart from the text. Other 1-, 2- and 3-line initials are in red and are not set apart from the text. 1-line initials within lessons are in black highlighted with red. Rubrics are written in red in the same script as the text. Punctuation consists of the punctus. Hyphenation is in the same ink as the text.

When they formed a bifolium, the fragments were used as the binding of a volume measuring ca. 305 x 200 mm. On fol. 1r and on fol. 2v there are mirror images of an unidentified printed text that offset onto the parchment while the leaves were serving as binding material.
