Punctuation consists of the punctus and the punctus interrogativus.

The fragment was used as a wrapper for a volume measuring ca. 160 x 110 mm. On the spine is written "Jo. de Turrecremata in Psalm" with the shelfmark "229" and in another hand the date "1524". Juan de Torquemada's (1388-1468) Expositio in Psalterium was printed in Venice in 1524 by Stefano da Sabbio.
