Primus and Felicianus (9 June). Fol. 3v is mostly illegible.

Parchment (badly damaged from mildew and from use in a binding). 3 folios (fols. 2 and 3 are a bifolium). 238 x 180 mm (written space 188 x 125 mm). 1 column. 16 lines. Dry-point ruling. Double vertical bounding lines.

Written in Caroline minuscule. The 3- and 4-line initials at the beginning of masses are in two styles: several initials are composed of hollow intertwining vines in red outline on a blue and green background; others initials are plain red square capitals. 1-line initials are in thick brown square capitals. 1-line initials of Psalm incipits are in brown rustic capitals. Rubrics are written in red rustic capitals; liturgical directions are in brown rustic capitals, as are the first few words of each mass. Punctuation consists of the punctus. Interlinear neumes are in the St. Gall style. Liturgical notes have been written in the margin of fol. 3v in a fifteenth-century cursive gothic hand.

Fol. 1 was used as a flyleaf for a volume measuring 238 x 167 mm. The bifolium was used as a pastedown in the binding of a volume measuring ca. 300 x 215 mm. Both fragments preserve a set of five rust stains in an X-pattern.
