Sunday after Holy Trinity. The lessons are from I John 4.12-21 and Luke 16.19-
25.

Parchment. 1 folio. 221 x 155 mm (written space 162 x 112 mm). 1 column. 21 lines. Dry-
point ruling.

Written in two sizes of late Caroline minuscule, with a smaller script for the chants and a
larger one for the lessons. 3-line initial "I" at the beginning of the lesson is in red, set apart from
the text. 1-line chant initials are in red uncials and are not set apart from the text. 1-line initials
within the lessons are in brown rustic capitals highlighted with red and are not set apart from the
text. Rubrics are written in red minuscule. Punctuation consists of the punctus and the punctus
elevatus.

The fragment was used as the wrapper for a volume measuring ca. 150 x 87 mm. On the
spine is written "Genera . Declinationes . Praeterita duplice".

A modern hand has written "x42" in pencil in the lower margin of the recto.
