Lamentations 4.9 - 5.22. The inner margin has been trimmed with loss of text.

Hebrews 6.1 - 6.7. The inner margin has been trimmed with loss of text.

Parchment. 1 folio. 275 x 208 mm (written space originally ca. 265 x 204 mm). 2 columns. 34
lines. Dry-point ruling on the hair side. Single vertical bounding lines.

Written in Caroline minuscule. Two 3-line initials outlined in brown, written on the
single vertical bounding line. 1-line capitals are in brown rustic capitals. Hebrew words in
Lamentations are written in rustic capitals. Interlinear neumes for the lessons from Lamentations
were added later. Punctuation consists of the punctus and the punctus elevatus.

According to Harmut Hoffmann (letter of 12 October 1997), this leaf is by the same hand
that copied the Homiliary fragments preserved in Melk, Cod. 793 (fols. I and 394), and in
Kremsmuenster, Fr. I/17. The fragment was used as a flyleaf in the binding of a volume
measuring ca. 275 x 193 mm.
