Copy of a Judicial Decision

Jacobus was bishop of Senigallia from 1232 to 1270 (see C. Eubel, *Hierarchia Catholica Medii Aevi* [Regensburg, 1913], 1:446). Sinibaldus was Cardinal priest of St. Laurentius in Lucina from 1227 to 1243 (See Eubel, 6-7 and 43).

Authenticated notarial copy of a decision of Bishop Jacobus of Senigallia, extracted from the protocols in the hand of the notary Benven[uto], by the notary Iohannes filius condam Iuliani, delegate of the rector of the Marca d'Ancona, Cardinal Sinibaldo, concerning a case between the monasteries of S. Iohannes peneclaria and S. Iacobus in burgo, both in Ancona. The verso contains the date and a brief description of the contents.

Written in notarial script by the notary Johannes, son of Julianus. The document begins with a flourished initial "I". 1-line initials are in brown. The notary's sign is in the center of the lower margin. Punctuation consists of the punctus and the punctus elevatus. Hyphenation is in the same ink as the text.
