lines (main text). Lead ruling. Single vertical bounding lines.

Text of the Digest in a rounded gothic script (*littera textualis*), that of the commentary in  
a smaller hand (*notularis*), perhaps later. Initials of the names of authorities alternate 1- and 2-  
line red and blue capitals, set apart from the text. The first word of each section begins with a 1-  
line capital alternating red and blue, not set apart from the text. Guide letters for both initials are  
written in light brown ink. Punctuation consists of the punctus. The number "X.I.I" is written in  
black ink in the upper right corner of the recto.
