30 lines remaining of an original ca. 35 lines. Lead ruling. Single vertical bounding lines.

Written in a rounded gothic script (littera textualis). Later marginal and interlinear notes. Initials of the names of authorities are 2- and 3-line blue capitals with red penwork and are set apart from the text. The initials of the first word of each section are 1-line red capitals and are not set apart from the text. 1-line initials within the text are in black and are not set apart from the text. Rubrics are written in red in the same script as the text. Paragraph marks are either red, blue or black and are set apart from the text when they occur at the beginning of a line. Punctuation consists of the punctus. Hyphenation is in the same ink as the text.

The fragment was used as part of a wrapper for a volume measuring ca. 200 x 150 mm. Zinniker 50-1.
