The crossbars of the letter are orange, decorated with white filigree and tipped with green; the bottom crossbar extends down the left margin where it ends in blue-grey, green and orange. 1-line initials and the letters of "Iubilate" following the initial alternate red with blue penwork and blue with red penwork. The first letter of the rubric is a blue uncial with red penwork, and the rest of the rubric is written in red. Punctuation consists of the punctus. Musical notation is in black on 4-line staves in red. The folio number "224" is written in the upper right corner of the recto in ink by a later hand.
