ff. 1r-31r      *Incomincia la summa della penitentia composta per misser fra Antonino arcivescovo di Firenze, etc.* Curam illius habe. Luce X<sup>o</sup> [Lk. 10:35]. Queste parole dixè il bon Samaritano al stabulario, overo albergatore, quando li mise nelle mani lo spogliato da' latroni et ferito a morte ... mortalmente o venialmente de tutti tenne doli et penti et dinne tua colpa, tua maxima colpa; et la penitentia, che io ti darro, falla con debita diligentia et devocione, etc. Explicit summa.                      f. 31v blank

Antoninus Florentinus (1389-1459), *Confessionale*, Italian version beginning "Curam illius habe", also known as *Medicina dell' anima*. Bloomfield 1291; Kaeppli 258. Printed from 1472 onward (GKW 2075-2079).

Paper, ff. 31, ..... folding. The quires are reinforced by means of parchment stays in their center.

I-II<sup>10</sup> (ff. 1-20), III<sup>10</sup> (+ one singleton, f. 31; ff. 21-31). Long horizontal catchwords in the center, framed.

Rake ruling for 27 lines above top line, ruling type 31, the vertical lines traced in lead??, the horizontal ones in ... ink ..... The scribe generally steps across the right bounding lines.

Copied by one hand writing Humanistica Cursiva under Gothic influence.

Headings in ... in smaller handwriting. On f. 1r a 2-line plain initial in red, with guide letter.

Sewn on four leather thongs. The binding is missing.

On the blank f. 31v s. XVII pen trials: "La sua balbutiente" (partly repeated several times) and "Signor (?) prete Antonio Barbi".
