Iohannes Diaconus, *Vita beati Gregorii*, II, 23. PL 75.96-97. A miracle from the life of St Gregory.

Artt. 1-5: faulty text; corrections by the scribes on erasure.

Parchment, ff. 208, 360 x 260 mm.

I-XXVI<sup>8</sup>. Short horizontal catchwords in the inner margin, close to the lower edge. Quire marks “I” – “VI” in the middle of the last page of quires I-VI (ff. 1-48), close to the lower edge.

Ruling in lead for two columns of 24 written lines below top line (where the ruling is double, there are 49 traced lines). Single bounding lines. The pricking system and the number of horizontal through lines differ from quire to quire.

Copied by several scribes in Northern Gothic Textualis Formata. A change of hands is visible between f. 120r and v.

Red stroking of majuscules. Red headings and explicit formulas. Alternately red and blue flourished initials or litterae duplices of various sizes, with penwork in the opposed colours or in both colours, sometimes very elaborate, extending into the margins or containing birds or fish.

English blue morocco binding over cardboard, by W.H. Smith and Son, Ltd., dated 1948. In the center of both covers a blind-tooled strapwork motif. Spine with raised bands; in the compartments the same strapwork motif, and the gold-tooled inscriptions “GREGORII / HOMILIAE” and “MS. / FROM ROYAU/MONT ABBEY / XIII CENT.” Two clasps.

Ownership inscription of the Cistercian abbey of Royaumont by a contemporary hand on f. 208r, in red: “Liber sancte Marie de Regali Monte”. Collections of Amans-Alexis Monteil (1769-1850); Thomas Phillipps (MS 1344, bookplate); Eric George Millar (bought from W.H. Robinson, 15 Nov. 1947,
